


## ABOUT SCENIC CAMBRIA

- Population: 6,500
- Elevation: Sea level to 200 feet

- Climate: Mild; no smog, clear blue skies, some seasonal fog, ocean breezes
- Average temperature: 50-70° F year-round
- Recreation: Hiking trails, bicycling, surfing, tide pools, rock hunting, fishing, kite and wind surfing, horseback riding, kayaking, lawn bowling, tennis, and more.
- Facilities: Picnic areas, public swimming pool, skate park, private golf and more.
- Arts & Culture: Various independent art studios and galleries, local live theater, and festivals offered throughout the year. Annual Cambria Art & Wine Festival held at the end of January.
- Activities & Attractions: Hearst Castle, elephant seal viewing, Piedras Blancas Lighthouse, Moonstone Beach, San Simeon Cove, Fiscalini Ranch Preserve, wine and beer tasting, whale watching, and more.
